## Okaloosa and Walton Counties Community Health Improvement Partnerships (CHIP)

Healthy Start proudly collaborates as a member of the CHIP groups in Okaloosa and Walton Counties.

These groups serve as a dynamic platform for collaboration, idea exchange, event planning, and networking among their members. Our Coalition actively participates in both the Healthy Moms & Babies Group and the Healthy Families Group. The primary mission of these partnerships is to engage community members from Okaloosa and Walton counties in health improvement initiatives through open, twoway communication. Key objectives include reducing the infant mortality rate,

enhancing mental health and substance use services, improving access to healthcare, supporting maternal and child health, promoting injury prevention and safety, addressing social determinants of health, and managing chronic diseases. Among the significant projects supported by our Healthy Start Coalition are the Fetal Infant Mortality Review, Recipe for a Healthy Baby, maternal advocacy initiatives, and breastfeeding support programs. Together, we are dedicated to fostering a healthier community.

#### **Top Four CHIP Partnership Initiatives**

### 1.FIMR: Fetal Infant Mortality Review

The Healthy Start Coalition of Okaloosa and Walton Counties is an active member of the Fetal and Infant Mortality Review (FIMR) team for District 1, which includes Escambia, Santa Rosa, Okaloosa, and Walton Counties. In collaboration with The National Center for Fatality Review and Prevention, we work to address the factors leading to infant and fetal deaths through in-depth case reviews. Our process includes audits of medical and social records and family interviews, which gather vital information and support families after their loss.


De-identified Case Summaries are created for monthly meetings with the Case Review Team, consisting of medical and community professionals, who analyze these cases and propose systemic-level changes. **A Community Action Group CAG** is formed to help implement these recommendations. FIMR emphasizes the collective responsibility of the community in ensuring every baby's survival and well-being. By examining individual cases and incorporating family insights, our teams seek to understand the causes of fetal and infant mortality and recommend targeted interventions for improvement.

## 2. Recipe For A Healthy Baby

Florida Healthy Babies is a statewide initiative aimed at ensuring every baby has an equal opportunity for a happy and healthy life. As part of Okaloosa's Florida Healthy Babies initiative, community partners have developed the "Recipe for a Healthy Baby," which serves as a simple guide to keeping infants safe and healthy. The Recipe for a Healthy Baby focuses on four key areas:

- Breastfeeding Your Baby
- Ensuring Safe Sleep for Your Baby
- Never Shaking a Baby
- Quitting Harmful Habits for Your Baby

## 3. Maternal Advocacy: Hear Her Campaign

Every year, a significant number of women in the United States die due to complications related to pregnancy and childbirth. The Hear Her campaign aims to deliver crucial information about urgent maternal warning signs, with the goal of saving lives. It offers resources for pregnant individuals, new parents, their supporters, and healthcare

professionals. The campaign focuses on raising awareness of severe pregnancy-related issues, empowering individuals to voice their concerns, fostering discussions within support systems, and providing tools to facilitate effective communication between patients and healthcare providers. The target audiences include pregnant individuals, those who have recently given birth, their supporters, and healthcare professionals. This initiative is backed by the CDC Foundation and funded by the Merck for Mothers Program. Hear Her is a trademark of the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services. Healthy Start distributes educational materials about the Hear Her Campaign and its warning signs to all OBGYN offices in Okaloosa and Walton counties. Additionally, we promote this topic through information on our social media platforms.

## 4. Breastfeeding: Lactation Lounges

At Healthy Start, we are committed to enhancing the health and well-being of pregnant women, new mothers, fathers, and families within our local community. One of the resources we provide is our Mamava Breastfeeding Pods, referred to as "Lactation Lounges." We understand the significance of creating safe spaces for breastfeeding mothers to feed their babies or express milk in public areas, including college campuses. Currently, we have Lactation Lounges available on the Northwest Florida State College Campus in **Niceville**, at the **Crestview** Public Library, and at the WIC office in **Fort Walton Beach**.

These pods are designed to support breastfeeding mothers and make their lives easier. They comply with all workplace and public-space lactation laws and are equipped with built-in seating, lighting, shelves, mirrors, coat hooks, outlets, and fans. Accessing the pods is simple and can be done through the Mamava app.



The Coalition hosted its World's Greatest Baby Shower event in May. A total of 223 moms attended, with 346 quests signing in. The event featured 46 sponsors and vendors. According to a survey conducted among participants, 95% rated the event as terrific or great. There was an increase of almost 50 attending moms this year compared to the previous year.













#### **Fatherhood Program**

The T.E.A.M. Dad program has taken significant steps to enhance its outreach and visibility in the community. In June, the program produced a public service announcement (PSA) featuring the testimony of one of its graduates. This PSA was broadcast on Cumulus stations, helping to spread awareness of the program's impact.

Additionally, the T.E.A.M. Dad initiative recently launched a Facebook page, which has seen encouraging growth. In a short time, the page garnered 114 likes and attracted 159 new followers. This strong initial engagement indicates a burgeoning online presence and increasing community interest in the

program.

To further promote fatherhood and the T.E.A.M. Dad program, a Family Fun event was hosted in June. This gathering invited fathers and their families to come together, celebrate fatherhood, and learn more about the initiative. The event was not only a joyful occasion but also a successful recruitment opportunity, as three fathers signed up to participate in the program during the festivities.

#### **Doula Program Updates**



We currently have six Doulas who have completed training and are ready to see clients. Our goal is to have 20 trained Doulas serving clients within two years. Our new office in Shalimar offers the perfect space for providing training and certification for future Doulas. To help meet our goal of 20 Doulas in 2026, our Coalition has recently applied for a grant from the Okaloosa County Department of Health to help cover the cost of providing Doula care to women not eligible for Medicaid!





In the past three months, our Doulas aided in the delivery of two happy, healthy babies! As we look ahead, we are excited by the prospect of helping many more women and babies have a healthy start to infant-hood.

#### **FIMR: Fetal Infant Mortality Review**


